

For: Leaders called specifically to ordination of Ministry of Word and Sacrament. This process is traditionally concurrent with a 3-year Master of Divinity seminary degree, while the leader is in relationship with a congregation of Heartland Presbytery, and prepares leaders to be ordained to any PCUSA congregation.

TNONIRER PHASE

In this phase, a leader becomes "under care" of home congregation, and receives endorsement by the Session. Leader will meet with CPM and receive a liaison who will support throughout the ordination process. A number of forms and personal writing will be required here.

CANDIDATE PHASE

Leader will complete a psychological evaluation, continue to meet with Session and CPM, and complete additional forms and personal writing. To enter this phase, the leader must appear before presbytery for questions regarding sense of call

CERTIFIED READY to Receive A CALL

This phase is typically entered near the end of the M.Div. degree. 1 Unit of CPE, a Field Education experience, and all ordination exams have been completed. A Personal Information Form and additional paperwork will be completed. After CPM endorsement, leader can begin searching for a congregation of call

() RDINATION

Ordination happens when a congregation decides to call the leader into service. The leader will be evaluated by either the calling presbytery, or Heartland Presbytery.



For: Leaders called to serve, typically within a specific congregation or community.

This process commissions leaders who are without a traditional seminary degree to preach and lead worship, administer the sacraments, perform weddings, and participate in the life of the presbytery.

Requirements

Be ordained as a Ruling Elder in the PCUSA.

Complete a psychological evaluation or Discerning Missional Leaders Assessment.

Complete 9 - 10 (pre-selected) online courses through:

- Dubuque Theological Seminary
- Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary
- Union Presbyterian Seminary

Complete a Field Education experience.

COMMISSIONING

Elders called to existing Heartland congregations will be commissioned by the Commission on Ministry, with evaluation and contracts renewed yearly. Elders called to serve New Worshipping Communities within Heartland Presbytery will be commissioned by the New Worshipping Communities Commisison, with evaluation and contracts renewed yearly.



For: Leaders called to create or serve New Worshipping Communities.

The NWCC walks with leaders to the hoped for creation of their community, and resources as a liason to the broader denomination for support.

Seep PHASE

Leader has spent time in prayer, discernment, and research 18 Months regarding the call to address spiritual and/or physical needs of a community. A full vision is not yet expected at this phase, but experimentation should be underway. Leader will complete the PCUSA 1001 NWC Seed Grant Application, and meet with NWCC for endorsement.

THISTMENT PHASE

Leader has completed the Discerning Missional Leaders Assessment, made reasonable progress towards community creation, demonstrated the ability to gather leaders, maintain financial records, maintain a healthy spiritual life, and is participating in the NWCC Discerners Group. Leader will complete the PCUSA 1001 NWC Investment Grant Application, and meet with NWCC for endorsement.

GROWTH PHASE

Leader has created a NWC, is engaged in an ongoing relationship with a 1001 NWC coach, and is supporting other leaders through the NWCC Discerners Group. Leader will complete the PCUSA 1001 NWC Growth Grant Application, and meet with NWCC for endorsement.
